"Before becoming a mother, Vinessa was a member of the Village of Paynton council for several years and a volunteer fire fighter.

"Her infectious laugh always lit up the room and her zest for life inspired those around her to do more. A few years ago Vinessa started her own business called Clearwater Canoeing. It was a natural fit as Vinessa was passionate about the environment, history and tourism in Saskatchewan and was a member or director on many boards. She seemed to know people all across Saskatchewan and beyond. She was also a huge supporter of local artists and was always thinking up ways to help others. "She took care of her dad for several years after an

oilfield accident put him in a wheelchair. Her father had many health issues, but Vinny was always on top of the most natural and safest ways to treat him, sometimes teaching medical staff a thing or two with her tireless research.



Vinessa would have been there to support Kate and the walkers, but in a way, she did at Bresaylor on May 12. Vinessa was the driving force behind building a clay oven to help increase tourism at Bresaylor Museum. She also planned to have school trips come through to use the oven when visiting the museum. This oven was lit in Vinessas's honour and cooked food for The Long Way Home crew along with their supporters, proving Vinessa's legacy lives on and will continue to do so for some time. 






The Paynton History Book is progressing nicely. Marie Ferguson and Roxanne Valiere and a small crew of very organized, hard workers are assembling volumes, so to speak. If you haven't done so, get your story in as soon as possible.

Mentioned before were early visitors to the Museum. Almost overlapping that visit was a quick stop by **Reg** and **Kate**Wearley from Montana. Reg is wanting to find out more about his ancestor, **Cleophas Sayers**, brother of Henry Sayers. They had to hurry off home, but perhaps will make another trip up this way. Does anyone know anything about Cleophas Sayers?

We received many letters indicating disappointment at the Parks Canada decision to NOT designate the Bresaylor Settlement a National Historic Event. Instead, they decided to enhance Fort Battleford's coverage of events involving the Bresaylor people during the Riel Rebellion by commissioning a series of paintings on the subject by a Metis artist. Ray Heighley was chosen to do the paintings. A good choice as he has done some fine works on Metis History. A grand opening is to take plade this summer. Which is all fine. Hopefully, the survival of the museum at Bresaylor will also be seen as worthwhile. Support for which we hope to quantify at our July 26 Brainstorming.

I was honoured to have been invited to the Milton/Rose Dobie family reunion. I only caught the end of it but it seemed like everyone had a great time. Bill, with the help of his wife, Charline, did a super job. We were pleased to have visits to the Museum from several of those travelling to or from the Dobie reunion, including Bill's mother Fern and brother Jim, who bypassed us the year before. It was also nice to have visits from several Foulds descendants last season. Susan Shacter is one very interested in her ancestor's connection to Bresaylor history. In September she was "about to return to school as a third year student studying Sociiology, Computer Science and Native Studies at the U. of S." And I believe it was Neil Foulds



whose father lived in Bresaylor, but I've forgotten his name. Heather Pollock writes about Doreen Williams, decendant of James Bremner, who visited us in 2012. "Doreen loved the entire trip but I think the visit with you folks topped it off." Doreen has just sent word that Jim Caplette has died. Jim was a true character of many talents who authored two very funny books, "Haywire" and "Older Than Dirt".

Beverly was instrumental in publishing the "Recipes and Remembrances" collection in memory of June Taylor; the family gave copies to the museum to sell.
